Going Deeper...

- 5. There is far more connection between individual Psalms than what many comprehend. Together Psalms 1 & 2 are an introduction to the book of Psalms.
 - What do Psalms 1 & 2 teach us about someone who is "blessed"?
 - In Psalm 1 the blessed man "meditates" on the law of the Lord while in Psalm 2 the people "meditate" in vain as they set themselves against the Lord and His Messiah (the word translated "plot" in Psalm 2:1 is the same word as "meditate" in Psalm 1:2) What are Psalms 1 & 2 teaching us by highlighting this contrast?
 - As an introduction to the Psalms what do they highlight as the key to the spiritual life of God's people?
 - When understood together, Psalms 1 & 2 point us to the ultimate "blessed" man – Who is it?

- 6. Why is the blessed man of Psalm 1 "like a tree planted by streams of water"?
- 7. How are nations and peoples still "raging" and "meditating in vain"?
- 8. Psalm 2:4-6 depicts God's response to the vain meditations of the nations.
 - What does it teach us about the sovereignty of God?
 - Why is this a source of great comfort when we consider the world in our present moment?
- 9. How would explain to someone that Jesus is your refuge in life?
