Going Deeper...

5. Psalms 32 and 33 are connected by a call for the righteous to “sing for joy” to the Lord – Psalm 32 ends with it and Psalm 33 begins with it.

- What reason(s) does Psalm 32 give us to sing for joy?
- What reason(s) does Psalm 33 give us to sing for joy?
- When you reflect on God’s unfailing love to you in Jesus do you feel the deep sense of joy? Why or why not?
- How may Psalms 32 and 33 help you focus on the joy you should feel in your life because of the gospel of Jesus?

6. In Psalm 33:3-4 David acknowledges that his body is sapped of strength because “God’s hand was heavy upon [him].”

- What experience is he describing?

- Why is this experience of God's heavy hand in our lives a work of His unfailing love?

7. Why is regular daily confession healthy for you soul?

8. Psalm 34 express our complete and utter dependence on the grace of God for salvation.

- How does it do this?
- How does Paul help us see the same truth in 1 Corinthians 1:26-31?
- Why is this music for our hearts?
