Going Deeper...

5. Jesus' interaction with the Pharisees (and other Jews) in chapter 8 is a continuation of his presence at the Feast of Tabernacles that began in chapter 7. This feast celebrated God's provision and presence as He led the people to the promised land through the wilderness.

In Jesus' day this feast had a particular ceremony that involved lighting 4 large oil lamps in the temple court of the women. These lights symbolised God's presence (His glory that filled the first temple), and the saving light to come promised in places like Isaiah 9:2 and 60:1-3.

When Jesus proclaims "I am the light of the world" what is He claiming about...

- Who He is?
- Why He has come?

6. In v. 24 Jesus tells the people that if you don't know who I am "you will indeed die in your sins" – Why is the belief that Jesus is God incarnate crucial to a saving faith?

- 7. Jesus is the truth who sets us free (vv. 31-36).
 - What does Jesus set us free from?
 - How does Jesus set us free?
- 8. This whole encounter Jesus has at the Feast of Tabernacles is centred around the question Who is Jesus? In v. 53 the Jews are deeply confused and ask Jesus, "Who do you think you are?"
 - How does Jesus answer them?
 - Why does what Jesus said in v. 58 appear crazy?
- 9. How does the truth that Jesus is God...
 - Assure us of our salvation?
 - Comfort us when we are struggling with sin?
 - Encourage us when life is hard?
